

Fraction Vocabulary Jigsaw Activity

This activity engages students in the discovery of roots, prefixes, and suffixes that bring meaning and nuance to content.

Prepare:

Decide how many students you want in each group. Four is the ideal group size. You can add symbols to make more groups. For example, adding a sun to half of the pieces will allow you to create smaller groups: a 'sun num' group and a plain 'num' group. Write various color words under the word parts before copying the puzzle pieces.

Copy the puzzle pieces on cardstock and cut them out. Make sure there are a few more pieces than there are students. This will give you some flexibility in making groups.

Make copies of the blank sunrise pages ~ one for each puzzle piece of the same name.

Collect or identify dictionaries and safe online resources for your students to visit while they collect information about the roots and affixes.

Round One: Word Part Research Groups: num, nom, de-, -ator

Give each student a puzzle piece. Have them meet in groups according to the word parts on top of their puzzle piece.

In round one, each group works together to:

- Research their root or affix
- Determine how their word part contributes to the meaning of fraction vocabulary
- Prepare talking points to share with others


Round Two: Word Study Groups: red, green, yellow, blue, orange, violet


Students move into new groups based on the colors listed on their puzzle pieces.


In round two, each group works together to:


- Combine the information from round one
- Use that information to create detailed definitions of 'numerator' and 'denominator'
- List any puzzles or questions that remain

Reflect: Let students share comments and reactions to the activity, in writing or discussion.











Vocabulary Sunrise: Prefix DE-

A prefix is a letter, word, or word part, attached to the front of words to change their meaning. For example, pre- is a prefix meaning before, ahead of time, in advance. Here are some examples: preface, premix, preheat, preschool, prevent, prepaid, and predict. As a prefix, de- has several meanings. At the beginning of a word, de- can mean 'down.' Decorate the sunrise with words that have the prefix de- meaning 'down.' Example

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Vocabulary Sunrise: Latin Root nom



Vocabulary Sunrise: Latin Root nom


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

Vocabulary Sunrise: Latin Root num


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


Vocabulary Sunrise: suffix -ator
