




Print pages 4 to 7 back to back. Follow the printing settings shown above. Always make a test copy first to ensure that the settings are correct.

To fold and assemble the book follow the directions in the video that accompanies this booklet. Be sure to practice before sharing this model with your class.

Inside of Book Jacket

These lines show how to fold the book jacket for the model. This side of the model will not show.

- 1. Print this page back to back with the following page. Make sure the back and front align.
- 2. Cut along the darkest solid line.
- 3. Use the small dots to make valley folds.
- 4. Use the light gray lines as 'fold up to' indicators. In other words, fold each edge up to the nearest light gray line and crease.
